Procedure	Warm up	Show We Bridge logo. In pairs/groups discuss meaning of bridge/symbols and give some examples
	Preparing for speaking 1	Give hand out 'The odd one out'- symbols for Wales, Scotland, Ireland and England. Work in pairs
	Preparing for speaking 2	Match definitions with symbols for Wales. Work in pairs, feedback on power point
	Speaking task 1	In groups decides which symbols belong to which country (France, Germany, Poland, Spain, Latvia) and what they mean. Feedback from countries. (Ss divided by country, they don't get symbols for their own country)
	Speaking task 2	In groups design a new symbol for your country. Share with other groups. What does it mean, why have you chosen it?
	Follow-up activity	When you go out, look around for symbols of Wales. Take a photo and bring to class. Tell others where you found it and what it represents.

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
